

Christopher Harney

Professional Biography

Mr. Harney is currently the Founder and President of **C Green Energy, LLC** (“CGE”) which was established in 2018. An energy solutions expert, Mr. Harney resided in Asia for more than 25 years, including Thailand and Myanmar. Mr. Harney is well-versed in alternative energies, emerging energy technologies, and strategic relations.

CGE is a registered company in the USA with primary capabilities to provide renewable energy solutions with synergistic technologies to private and public utility companies. The company has spent the past two years working with the developer and owner of a new electromagnetic and laser technology that reduces the toxic carcinogenic emissions (Dioxins, Furans, etc.) from the coal power plants by greater than 95%, CO by greater than 70% and CO₂ by greater than 40%. This technology will help mitigate communities’ concerns over coal fire power plants and enhance Thailand’s Power Development Plan. This coal emissions reduction technology (“CERT”) also reduces power plant’s coal feedstock requirements by 18% or more for the same level of electricity output, thereby enabling and strengthening the operator’s business sustainability and its country’s overall energy security.

CGE retains the exclusive licensing rights for the CERT technology covering all of Asia, excluding the People’s Republic of China. CGE is currently negotiating the first retrofit installation in Thailand with National Power Supply Co. and expects to be operational within 6 months.

Prior to founding CGE, Mr. Harney was Founder and President of **Globalmax Group, LLC** based in Boston, MA, USA and Bangkok, Thailand from the 1998 to 2015. The primary focus of the business was to provide consulting services for corporations seeking to enter the Asian market. The business also provided broad-based English language management services for large corporate and governmental agencies in Thailand.

From 1988-1997, Mr. Harney was President of **Arvin International, Inc.** (“Arvin”). He founded this company with the former owner of Reebok, Paul Fireman. Arvin was an international trading and investment company based in Yangon, Myanmar and Boston, Massachusetts, U.S.A. The company’s focus was on: trade and countertrades, distributorship and/or representation arrangements with foreign companies, and consulting arrangements. The major industries which Arvin participated in were: agricultural products, mining, chemical products, educational materials, manufacturing, machinery, and equipment. Some notable clients of Arvin include: Coca-Cola, Digital Equipment Corporation, Unocal, Reebok International, Spaulding

Sports Worldwide, Perini International, Stockdale Prospecting Limited, Pioneer International, Ltd., Austrade, Citizen's Energy, LeBoeuf, Lamb, Leiby & MacRae, Frank B. One of Arvin's most notable achievements was to secure the **exclusive distribution rights for all Coca-Cola** products in the country. Arvin competed again over 100 companies both foreign and domestic to win this contract.

Educational Materials Program

As an active member of the local and foreign community in Myanmar, Mr. Harney facilitated many **charitable projects**. One example was the donation of a US\$1 million Book Donation Project in conjunction with the Coca-Cola Foundation. This project provided college level textbooks for universities throughout the country. Mr. Harney also arranged the donation of a US\$250,000 Medical Library for the Myanmar Medical Association. Both of the aforementioned projects were notable since they were the first books allowed in the country that were not censored. Responding to the need for the latest fitness education, Mr. Harney coordinated the donation of a world-class fitness center in by Weider International which opened in 1993.

From 1986 to 1988, Mr. Harney took over the post of **United States Information Agency Goodwill Ambassador** to Myanmar from his father, professional golfer Paul Harney. He had been accompanying his father to Myanmar in that capacity regularly since 1971. In 1988, Mr. Harney developed a National Golf Training Program for the country designed to produce world-class golfers. He donated over \$200,000 worth of golf and sports-related equipment in conjunction with various companies.
